We've worked through every season on behalf of Michigan's historic places. Here are the highlights:

ONLINE: Through our popular webinars funded in-part by the Michigan Arts and Culture Council, we covered place-based topics such as the Underground Railroad in Cass County, the Mushroom Houses of Charlevoix, and the 1876 Vermilion US Live-Saving Station; we learned about landmark building rehab projects like the Book Tower in Detroit and The Milton in Battle Creek; and we provided connections to several grant opportunities through state-level programs such as the Michigan Arts & Culture Council, the Michigan Main Street Program, and the Certified Local Government Program. We also participated in several programs given by partners such as the Michigan Economic Development Corporation and the Michigan Downtown Association.

IN-PERSON: Attendance held strongly at our largest educational gathering, the 44th Annual Statewide Preservation Conference, which brought together over 300 participants in beautiful downtown Kalamazoo. Judging by the standing-room-only Opening VIP reception at the Richardsonian Romanesque-style Ladies Library Association, we reaffirmed our reputation for throwing magnificent parties. During the year, we held four in-person programs including Commissioner Training Workshops in Pontiac and Saugatuck, a masonry workshop in Grand Rapids, and a hands-on wood window repair workshop on Saturday morning at the Kalamazoo conference. In 2025, you'll see our hands-on programs expanding!

IN YOUR INBOX: *NetworkNews* continued its monthly on-line schedule, with plans for expanded content thanks to new capacity from Board Member Tiffany Dzuirman. And due to our staff's diligent efforts, the Historic Resource Council Directory continues to be a trusted and reliable source for quality preservation trades.

CONNECTING & COLLABORATING: The MHPN accomplished all these things and more, greatly aided by the leadership of our Executive Director, Brenda Rigdon, and our Founding Board Member, Janet Kreger. Thanks to their presence, and the work of our dedicated Board and Staff, our moods this past year have grown lighter, more optimistic, and more collaborative than we have seen in a long time.

We have made substantial progress on stabilizing our finances, grounding our staff, creating operational efficiencies, and generating more innovation in the organization. As we look ahead at our work together, we are now positioning ourselves more intentionally with our evolving message that historic preservation is not only about economic vitality and preserving the past, but also about climate resiliency and sustainability.

MHPN receives two grants from the Michigan Arts & Culture Council (MACC)

MHPN is honored to be the recipient of two MAAC grants for 2025! The first is a \$25,673 grant through MACC's Mission Support Program which receives National Endowment for the Arts funding. MHPN will continue to help communities and individuals preserve and revitalize the historic places that make every region of Michigan distinctive. Our webinars will reach out around the state, while our annual statewide conference will draw people together in Sault Ste. Marie in 2025. Our assistance can range from responding to a phone inquiry, to an on-site property visit, to a presentation before a community group or city council, to writing an editorial, blog, or position paper.

The second is a \$30,000 Partnership Opportunity Grant, a new MACC program that will support two kinds of in-person training. First, MHPN will offer our popular hands-on workshops in such areas as historic masonry, plasterwork, and wood window restoration. Using the trades-talent in our network, the MHPN can present its own small-group programs around the state or provide our construction industry partners modules for their workforce training programs. Second, we will expand our Commissioner Training Workshops (CTW). Michigan has 81 communities with locally-established ordinances that protect their historic districts. The CTWs train the Commissioners who oversee restoration work in these districts.
